# **Parables**

Parables are some of the most difficult texts to preach about. Part of the difficulty is that a parable is not a narrative, a story. A parable is the opposite of a story; it is an anti-narrative. The design of the parable is shift consciousness completely, to give you a new head, a different set of eyes, so that you see the world differently. As such a parable is something to experience rather than think about. The parables in Mark 4.26-34 offer the experience of death as a gateway to life. The scattered seeds, like the mustard seed, must allow themselves to die. Buried in the dirt, these seeds are cracked wide open, exposing the vulnerable seed-flesh inside. Mud and water seep in before a fragile

arm-like shoot reaches out towards the sun. Jesus will himself become a parable, allowing his own life to end as a gateway to a love that conquers death. What are the life giving ways that we can welcome self-surrender this week?
