We acknowledge and pay respects to the traditional custodians of the land, on which we worship, work and meet, the Bundjalung people. I recognize the significant role the past and future Elders play in the life of the region. I am mindful that within and without the beautiful sandstone church, the Land always was and always will be Aboriginal Land.

Ire naeus once said that Jesus became what we are (human) so that we can become what he in fact is (divine). C.S. Lewis once said, "Every Christian is to become a little Christ. The whole purpose of becoming a Christian is simply nothing else." Christian spirituality is about becoming Christ, being Christ. Christian spirituality is the

transformation that love brings about, it is a transformation so complete that our identity becomes that of the one we love ... Jesus the Christ.

If we take this "being made into Christ" seriously, the Eucharist is not something we celebrate once a week. The Eucharist is who we are becoming. Jesus said "I am the Living Bread." We may dare to say "we are becoming Living bread". St Augustine gave communion to people at the altar with the words "the body of Christ". People were to respond with the words "Yes I am."

We become what we eat: the living bread. We are to become the Eucharist. The Eucharist is not a weekly event separate from our day to day activities. The Eucharist is our very identity; the Eucharist is who we are in our deepest selves it is who we are becoming.

How can we live the Eucharist? How can we become Eucharist?

Today's Gospel Reading: John 6:24-35

24 So when the crowd saw that neither Jesus nor his disciples were there, they themselves got into the boats and went to Capernaum looking for Jesus. 25When they found him on the other side of the lake, they said to him. 'Rabbi, when did you come here?' 25 Jesus answered them, 'Very truly, I tell you, you are looking for me, not because you saw signs, but because you ate your fill of the loaves. 27 Do not work for the food that perishes, but for the food that endures for eternal life, which the Son of Man will give you. For it is on him that God the Father has set his seal.' 28 Then they said to him, 'What must we do to perform the works of God?' 29 Jesus answered them, "This is the work of God, that you believe in him whom he has sent." 30 So they said to him. What sign are you going to give us then, so that we may see it and believe you? What work are you performing? 31 Our ancestors ate the manna in the wilderness; as it is written, "He gave them bread from heaven to eat." '32 Then Jesus said to them, Very truly, I tell you, it was not Moses who gave you the bread from heaven, but it is my Father who gives you the true bread from heaven, 32 For the bread of God is that which comes down from heaven and gives life to the world." 34 They said to him, 'Sir, give us this bread always.' 25 Jesus said to them, 'I am the bread of life. Whoever comes to me will never be hungry, and whoever believes in me will never be thirsty.
